


4.Preclude

8.Epicurean



Usage: The epicurean enjoyed every course of the long feast.






16.Dismay

Definition: not showing or accepting things as they are Usage: The dialogue in the movie was unrealistic

20.Imbibe

Definition: 1) to drink something, especially alcohol2) to absorb something, especially informationUsage : She imbibed vast quantities of coffee.

21.Laborious



Definition: taking a lot of time and effort Usage: The volunteers have been commendably laborious in their cleanup of the beach

Definition: The fact of being excessively conceited or absorbed in oneself Usage: His vain egotism prevented him from apologizing for what was clearly his fault.

Definition: to destroy or get rid of something completely, especially something bad Usage: The only dreaded disease to have been totally eradicated is smallpox which was wiped out more than two decades ago.

Definition : energy and enthusiasm Usage : He fell in love with her for her vitality and sense of fun.

26.Illiterate




Definition: 1. Unable to read and write.~n
