1.Asterisk



<u>Definition</u>: the symbol (*) placed next to a particular word or phrase to make people notice it or to show that more information is given in another place

<u>Usage:</u> The student claimed there were so many allusions in the text that the asterisks made her "see stars".

2.Anesthetic



<u>Definition:</u> something (as a drug) that relieves pain <u>Usage</u> : the dentist waited until the anesthetic took effect.

3. Desolate



Definition: empty and without people, making you feel sad or frightened

2) very lonely and unhappy

Usage: A desolate house abandoned many years ago

4.Peroration



Definition: a flowery and highly rhetorical oration

<u>Usage:</u> Perorations were very much in practice in earlier times; today we prefer to be factual describing things as they are not as we imagine.

5.Gourmand



<u>Definition:</u> a person who is devoted to eating and drinking to excess <u>Usage:</u> The man was a gourmand not getting satiated with the variety and quantity of food he took endlessly.

6.Mellifluous



Definition: sounding sweet and smooth

Usage: The mellifluous sound of the clarinet lulled angelina into a state of relaxation

7.Assorted



<u>Definition:</u> of various different sorts <u>Usage:</u> A box of assorted chocolates

8.Peevish



<u>Definition</u> : easily annoyed by unimportant things <u>Usage</u>: Lack of sleep always made him peevish.

9.Dexterity



<u>Definition</u>: skill in using your hands or your mind <u>Usage :</u> The medical student marvelled at the surgeon's dexterity in the smart incisions and stitches he made on the patient's body

10.Tepid



<u>Definition</u>: Moderately warm <u>Usage</u>: It is advisable to wash a wound with clean tepid water not cold or hot.

11.Brevity—வீரம் /**சுருக்கம்/short time**



<u>Definition</u>: the quality of using few words when speaking or writing the fact of lasting a short time

Usage: "the brevity of life"

12.Florid



<u>Definition:</u> having too much decoration or detail | red <u>Usage</u> : " florid style of writing "

13.Analogy



<u>Definition</u>: a comparison of one thing with another thing that has similar features; a feature that is similar

2) the process of comparing one thing with another thing that has similar features in order to explain it

<u>Usage : The teacher drew an analogy between the human heart and a pump.</u>



14.Unified

Definition: formed or united into a whole

<u>Usage:</u> Akbar not content with just invasion unified all his provinces to think in terms of belonging to one nation.

15.Deterrence



<u>Definition:</u> a thing that makes someone less likely to do something 2) the act of preventing a particular act or behavior from happening <u>Usage:</u> Hopefully his punishment will act as a deterrent to others.

16.Annul



<u>Definition</u> to state officially that something is no longer legally valid <u>Usage</u> The new rule book was welcomed by all as it annulled all the older rules which were neither significant nor beneficial.

17.Rabid



<u>Definition</u> having very strong feelings about something and acting in an unacceptable way violent or extreme

<u>Usage</u> Police arrived in force to quell the riot set off by rabid soccer fans.

18.Manifest



<u>Definition</u> 1) to show something clearly, especially a feeling, an attitude, or a quality 2) to appear or become noticeable Usage Their sadness was manifest in their faces.

19.Regressive



<u>Definition</u> becoming or making something less advanced | having less effect on the rich than on the poor

<u>Usage</u> The boys were suddenly regressed when their team lost.

20.Bifurcation



<u>Definition</u> Division into two branches, parts, or aspects. Point at which division occurs. <u>Usage</u> A divisive issue that caused the bifurcation of the political party

21.Amorous



<u>Definition</u> showing sexual desire and love toward someone <u>Usage</u> She is the object of his amorous intentions.


22.Cataclysm



<u>Definition</u> a sudden disaster or a violent event that causes change, for example a flood or a war

<u>Usage</u> The country barely survived the cataclysm of war.

23.Renege



<u>Definition</u> to break a promise, an agreement, etc. <u>Usage</u> She reneged on her promise to buy her son a bike

24.Ramshackle



<u>Definition</u> in a very bad condition and needing repair | badly organized or designed and not likely to last very long <u>Usage</u> "ramshackle set of buildings'

25.Retaliate



<u>Definition</u> to do something harmful to someone because they have harmed you first <u>Usage</u> " need to take action before the enemy retaliates"

26.Contravene



<u>Definition</u> to do something that is allowed by a law or rule <u>Usage</u> The overcrowded dance club contravened safety regulations

27.Leery




<u>Definition</u> suspicious or careful about something or someone, and trying to avoid doing it or dealing with them <u>Usage</u> She hesitated stepping into the friendly crowd because she was leery of strangers.

28.Vigilant



<u>Definition</u> very careful to notice any signs of danger or trouble <u>Usage</u> The vigilant police officer noticed the robber sneaking into the jewelry store.





<u>Definition:</u> 1) covering a large area; great in amount 2) including or dealing with a wide range of information <u>Usage</u> The blast caused extensive damage.

30.Fluctuate



<u>Definition</u> to change frequently in size, amount, quality, etc., especially from one extreme to another

<u>Usage</u> Body temperatures can fluctuate when you are ill.
