Govt plans to change security marks of notes every 3-4 years



To check counterfeiting, the government plans to change security features of higher denomination banknotes of Rs2,000 and Rs500 every 3-4 years in accordance with global standards.

National News

- The move comes in the wake of recovery of a large amount of fake Indian currency notes in last four months after demonetisation.
- The issue was discussed threadbare at a high-level meeting on Thursday attended by senior officials of the ministries of finance and home, including Union home secretary Rajiv Mehrishi.
- Advocating the move, home ministry officials said most of the developed countries change security features of their currency notes every 3-4 years and therefore, it is absolutely necessary for India to follow this policy.
- The change in design of Indian currency notes of higher denominations was long due.
- Till it's demonetisation, there had been no major change in the Rs1,000 note since its introduction in 2000.

Govt to exempt education, healthcare from GST



Education, healthcare and pilgrimages will continue to be out of the service tax net under the Goods and Services Tax (GST) regime as the Centre wants to avoid any shock in the first year of the rollout by bringing in new services.

National News

- Besides making a strong case to the GST Council for not including services that are out of tax net currently, the Centre will also pitch for keeping concessional rate for services like transport at the current level.
- The GST Council, headed by Finance Minister Arun Jaitley and comprising representatives of all states, is scheduled to meet in Srinagar on May 18-19 to decide on rates various good and services will be charged in the new indirect tax regime that is being targeted for rollout from July 1.
- Adhia said the endeavour would be to maintain the current tax incidence on a commodity or service at the same level in the new GST regime.

- The distance between Chenani and Nashri will now be 10.9 kms (between two

- World Autism Day is also one of only four official health-specific UN Days.
- Autism is a lifelong developmental disability that manifests itself during the first three years of life.

Japan officially announces Bitcoin as currency



Bitcoin has finally gained the recognition of a mainstream currency along the lines of other fiat currencies.

GLOBAL NEWS

- The privilege follows the implementation of a new law in Japan which categorizes Bitcoin as a legal payment option within the country.
- The much-awaited law went into effect on April 1, 2017 (beginning of a new fiscal year in many countries).
- With the new law's implementation, Bitcoin exchanges will also come under additional regulatory scrutiny.
- The recognition of cryptocurrency as a legal tender also means the applicability of regulations governing banks and financial institutions to cryptocurrency exchange platforms.
- They will be required to comply with strict anti-money laundering (AML) and Know Your Customer (KYC) requirements, along with annual audits.
- Other requirements include meeting the stated capital and cyber security requirements to ensure consumer protection.
